

Wound Care Open

Wound care instructions

- Leave the original dressing dry and in place for 24 hours.
- Ensure Hands are washed thoroughly with soap and water before attending wound care
- After 24 hours follow these steps:

- 1. Remove the dressing soak dressing off in shower if needed.
- 2. Clean with sterile saline solution 0.9% Sodium Chloride
- 3. Allow to dry
- 4. Apply a thin layer of Vaseline over wound to keep moist
- 5. If exposed to a dirty environment, Cover wound with a dry, non-stick dressing
- 6. Repeat steps 1-5 morning and night until healed.

If bleeding occurs:

- Elevate the area if possible, sit or lay still.
- Apply continuous firm pressure to the area for 30 minutes
- If bleeding continues, please contact the selected surgery below.

Signs of Infection to look out for:

- Increased redness
- Increased pain
- Hot to touch
- Oozing

Frequently used dressings/Wound care items:

- Dry NON STICK dressing pads
- Fixomull/Hyper fix (white meshed adhesive dressing)
- Micropore (skin colour tape)
- Allevyn (pink in colour used on donor sites)
- Jelonet (white soft paraffin impregnated gauze
- Vaseline (white soft paraffin)
- Sterile Normal Saline (0.9% Sodium Chloride)
- Cotton tip applicators (4-6 per dressing change)
- Steri strips (used post removal of stitches)
